Why KSA?

BYU Independent Study (BYU IS) high school courses have always focused on providing excellent learning opportunities for students with each course tied to standards. To more fully engage high school learners, BYU IS provides innovative ways to fulfill all aspects of a student's learning experience.

Abundant research shows that students retain knowledge and take higher-level sequence courses when they understand how subject knowledge applies to real life and can be used to help them advance their educational and career goals.

While we have always been big on instilling knowledge in lasting ways, we're excited to announce a whole new level of applicability in online education. Our new courses engage the whole learner by combining knowledge, skills, and attributes.

We believe that courses developed around a framework of knowledge, skills, and attributes (KSA) result in deeper learning outcomes and are mutually reinforcing. They have concrete meaning and can be expressly taught, learned, and measured. This framework identifies what we refer to as The Portrait of a Learner, or the ideal characteristics (KSAs), that are cultivated in a student who completes a BYU Independent Study online course.

If you're like most people, you remember new knowledge better if it has been applied in practical ways. Using new knowledge solidifies it in our consciousness and helps us easily retrieve what we've learned.

In addition to compounding knowledge and practical skills, our new course portfolio also includes deep questions and opportunities for students to learn how to comfortably connect and interact with others.

These developed attributes can help them become more emotionally resilient and successful in their academic and personal lives.

Kindness	Relationship Skills	Developing positive relationships
	Social Awareness	Showing concern for the feelings of others
Resilience	Self-Awareness	Having a growth mindset
	Self-Management	Identifying and using stress management strategies
Respect	Relationship Skills	Standing up for the rights of others
	Self-Awareness	Developing interests and a sense of purpose
Responsibility	Responsible Decision-Making	Anticipating and evaluating the consequences of one's actions
